Michelle Bachelet

- Michelle Bachelet is a humans rights advocate.
 - She is the first woman President of Chile.
- Currently, she is the UN Human Rights Chief.



Damilol Odufuwa

- Damilol Odufuwa is a successful entrepreneur from Nigeria.
 - She created the Feminist Coalition in 2020 with Odunayo Eweniyi.
- One of the Feminist Coalition's first projects was organizing a food drive for low-income women and their families.



Demecia Yat

- Demecia Yat is part of a group respectfully called the *abuelas*.
 - She is a survivor of the 1954-1996 conflict in Guatemala.
 - The *abuelas* fought their case in the nation's highest court which granted 18 reparation measures to the survivors.



Malala Yousafzai

- Malala Yousafzai is an women's rights activist from Pakistan.
 - She was attacked by the Taliban, but after recovering she continued her activism.
- She won the Nobel Prize at 17 making her the youngest to ever win.



Gordana Comic

- Gordana Comic is the Minister for Human and Minority Rights and Social Dialogue in the Republic of Serbia.
- She is a founder of the Women's Parliamentary Network of the National Assembly.
 - She has been an important figure in Serbia for the fight for women's equality.



Gloria Steinem

- Gloria Steinem is a feminist activist and acclaimed writer from the United States.
 - She has received the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
- She was a columnist for New York magazine and co-founded Ms. Magazine.



Ellen Johnson Sirleaf

- Ellen Johnson Sirleaf is Africa's first democratically-elected woman president.
 - She was the president of Liberia.
 - She was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for her work.



Alaa Murabit

- Alaa Murabit is a Libyan-Canadian doctor.
- She is also a global security strategist and women's rights advocate.
- She is the youngest to be appointed United Nations High-Level Commissioner.



Emtithal Mahmoud

- Emtithal Mahmoud was born in Khartoum, Sudan.
- She is a world champion slam poet and activist for the refugee cause.
